

DENK HEDGEHOG-SNAIL

Find a quiet spot in the garden, such as under bushes or along the edges of hedges. Remove the top layer of soil to a depth of about 5 cm. The ground should be dry and free of grass or a layer of leaves. As an insulating layer, sprinkle sand or fine gravel into the depression. Water should not pool under the *Hedgehog-Snail*.

Cover the bottom layer with straw, hay, wood shavings, etc., to create a cushioning layer. The hedgehog will find additional nesting material on its own. If you find a young hedgehog that needs to hibernate, you should add extra padding to the *Hedgehog-Snail*. In addition, it is necessary to feed the young hedgehog regularly with hedgehog food.

Place the *Hedgehog-Snail* in the prepared spot and cover it with the excavated soil. You can also use bark mulch, straw, and small twigs to cover it. This keeps the hedgehog safe from curious pets and also provides additional protection from the cold.

Our *Hedgehog-Snails* are permanently frost-resistant, do not weather, and can therefore remain in the garden year-round. The ceramic cave provides the hedgehog with a natural nesting and hibernation spot, similar to rock cavities, crevices in the ground, or piles of wood.
