

Material & Cleaning

Unlike wood or wood-concrete, our ceramic is not damaged by natural decay. CeraNatur ceramic regulates humidity, does not develop mold, does not require waterproofing, and is frost-resistant.

Cleaning the hedgehog house is only required and necessary after hibernation (in the spring)—once it is no longer inhabited.

The ceramic can be cleaned with dish soap and a brush or even with a steam cleaner. Old nesting material should be removed. We hope you enjoy and have success with sustainable species conservation using this product from our workshop. We offer a 15-year warranty on weather resistance.

The Hedgehog—A Gardener's Favorite

The hedgehog proves to be a faithful helper in the garden. Its diet consists of insects and larvae, and it doesn't turn its nose up at slugs either. Every gardener needs a friend like this—one that's usually out of sight.

The hedgehog is nocturnal and retreats to its den during the day. This den should not only be warm and comfortable; it must also protect the hedgehog and its young from prowling dogs and curious cats.

The hedgehog stays within its garden territory once it has found sufficient food and a good nesting spot. Then it doesn't have to roam the area and is safe from cars.

The hedgehog house is used year-round—for hibernation in winter and for raising young in the summer.

Assembly

Place the hedgehog house directly on the ground. Be sure to remove any grass or leaves first.



First, place the dome on the floor. Then carefully slide the entry tube into the opening. There is a ridge built into the dome, so the tube can only be inserted about 2 cm.



Now cover the hedgehog house with soil, sod, leaves, and branches, leaving the entrance open. The covering serves as insulation and camouflage. This way, the hedgehog or the hedgehog family is protected and safe. CeraNatur ceramic is particularly sturdy and will not be damaged by the weight of the covering.
